  - c. Director Brock- this week her committee has been working on going to other organizations throughout the rest of the semester. The homecoming meeting is Friday, November 6th in Kennesaw Hall 1203 at 11 AM. Constitution Day is Friday, November 6th in the University rooms from 6 PM to 9 PM. Owl reaches are next week. On the Kennesaw Campus, November 10th 11 AM to 1 PM on the green and the Marietta Campus November 11th 11 AM to 1 PM in front of stingers. She emailed Dianne Summey about Meet the Presidents for next semester, but has not gotten a response yet.

- d. Director Fernandez- Director Fernandez has met with State Rep. David Clark on Tuesday, Nov 3rd. He talked about his passion for America and for wanting to make a positive difference in our generation. He spoke about the casino bill that is coming up next year and how it pertains to higher education. He explain into detail about how if casinos comes to Georgia such as the MGM plans to do this will increase the HOPE scholarship thus making higher education institutions such as KSU increase their tuition. He told us that our generation and our SGA should get more involve in state legislature next session. State legislature usually in charge of higher education in the state and affects public institutions on a greater scale. Director Fernandez has emailed Director Vadlamudi about creating his flyer for the VKSU and SGA event coming up on the 14th. This event will be opened to any students that want to volunteer. He is also meeting up with Attorney General about internships and more opportunities for KSU students such as the one he has already lock down for Social Science students who are interested in working next year for State Rep. Reeves and Carson. Director Fernandez talked to the dean of the political science department and they did not offer internship credit for those representatives just because the have a different application process that is more filtered but due to the fact that both Carson and Reeves serve on the Political Science committee they would make an exception.
- e. Director Kramschuster- Director Kramschuster attended the UPCC meeting on October 22. At the committee meeting, the members discussed how many Kennesaw major programs are gated, which is the majority of the classes. We discussed the pros and cons of programs being gated. Discussion also included the length of syllabus across the university and efforts to move towards shorter syllabus using a link to all the university policies. The

Academic Affairs committee is still gathering student input regarding academic advisement and beginning to prepare for Fuel for Finals. Director Kramschuster has been discussing with the Department Chair for the ATT major regarding overrides into Coles business classes. DegreeWorks for Marietta students is finally up and running since consolidation has been finalized. Upcoming appointments are elections committee on November 4<sup>th</sup> at 6pm, UPCC on November 5<sup>th</sup>, and a meeting with the AVP of Enrollment Services on November 6<sup>th</sup> to discuss Reading Days. - g. VP Delaney- Vice President Delaney and President Roberson attended the Strategic, Thinking, and Planning Committee this past Monday, which consists of over forty university faculty and Board of Regents members. The majority of the conversation centered on who KSU will evolve with the times of technology, especially since more students are finishing BS degrees that normally take four years to complete, in three years or less. Also, it

was talked about how technology might help the students on the edge of dropping, failing, or withdrawing from a class to be successful. Vice President Delaney will be sending a representative to the Faculty Senate meeting this coming Monday so that SGA has a presence at the table. Yen Rodriguez approached Vice President Delaney and President Roberson about having some of his students attend the SGA tailgate this coming Saturday as part of their exchange experience from Florida. Please be on the lookout for them and invite with a warm KSU welcome! Lastly, Vice President Delaney spoke about SGA attending the Georgia Collegiate Leadership Conference (GCLC) at UGA. The conference will be held on February 26th and 27th, however, to save money, SGA will only be attending the 27th day. For those who want to go, Vice President Delaney made a Doodle for people to sign up on. Also, Vice President Delaney said that people attending the conference must submit to him a two to three paragraph paper about what they expect to gain from attending the conference. All participants who attend GCLC will give a joint presentation when they come back from the conference, more than likely at the SGA Gala. Interns are allowed to sign up to go to GCLC as well. Vice President Delaney said the deadline to submit the papers to him will be on November 15th, at 11:59pm, since the deadline to apply to go as a group is on the 16th.
